Why consider Concentrated OYAP in Transportation?

- **Transportation Concentrated OYAP** is specifically designed to help secondary school students make a smooth transition directly into the post-secondary apprenticeship program
- This program can be done as a Specialist High Skills Major
- May complete their first level of in-school apprenticeship training (level 1 Auto Service Tech) through dual credits with Mohawk College. (presently available through MM Robinson and White Oaks S.S.)
- Receive Standard First Aid, Adult CPR, Young Worker Awareness and WHMIS
- May shorten their apprenticeship by receiving apprenticeship hours while being registered as an OYAP apprentice in cooperative education
- May get their foot in the door with a potential employer
- Similar courses are offered at both colleges and private vocational training facilities. Why not start the program before you leave high school?

How does this program work?

This program takes 2 semesters to complete. In the first of the semesters, you will take a minimum of 2 grade 11 Transportation credits plus 2 other credits and in a second semester, you will take 2 grade 12 Transportation credits plus 2 credits coop in your area of specialty.
