Course Package

Each SHSM program offers students a bundle of 8 - 10 credits. These courses are regular Ontario secondary school courses that allow students to work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, but have been bundled as the most relevant courses to prepare students for a future in the arts and culture sector.

The Bundle Includes:

- 4 "major" credits in arts and culture in grade 11 and 12
- **Supporting credits**, which include Contextualized Learning Activities (opportunities for students to learn the subject in the context of the arts and culture sector):
 - > Grade 11 and/or 12 English credit
 - > Business Studies or Canadian and World Studies
 - > 2 Cooperative Education credits to experience life in the arts and culture sector

Applying to the Arts & Culture SHSM:

All students in Halton are able to attend the Arts & Culture SHSM at Craig Kielburger SS in grade 11 or grade 12. Each student's goals will be assessed and course selection will be determined based on individual needs.
