Why consider Concentrated OYAP in Transportation?

- The Accredited Niagara College Transportation Concentrated OYAP is specifically designed to help students make a smooth transition directly into their post-secondary Transportation apprenticeship
- The Transportation OYAP students may complete their first level of automotive apprenticeship theory training through the Niagara College accredited program at Georgetown District High School
- This program can be completed in conjunction with the Specialist High Skills Major Program (SHSM)
- May shorten the apprenticeship term by working towards your Ministry appointed Competency Book and Apprenticeship Hours while in high school

In the Transportation OYAP program, you may:

- Demonstrate skills and apprenticeship knowledge while in co-op to a potential employer, accelerating the hiring process
- Receive Standard First Aid, Adult CPR, Young Worker Awareness with a WHMIS certification
- Get a head-start on your program before leaving high school, instead of taking similar courses (and paying for those) offered at colleges or private vocational training facilities after high school

HOW DOES THIS PROGRAM WORK?

This program takes 2 semesters to complete. In the first semester, you will take a minimum of 2 grade 11 Transportation credits plus an additional 2 other credits. In the second semester, you will take 2 grade 12 Transportation credits plus 2 co-op credits in your area of specialty.

Opportunities in Transportation OYAP

You could find a very rewarding career as a mechanic or technician working on cars, planes, motorcycles, small engines, truck, coaches or heavy equipment.

Apprenticeship

- Lets you earn \$\$ while you learn
- Are a combination of on-the-job training and College courses
- Allows you to be taught one-on-one by a Skilled tradesperson
- An apprenticeship contract is an agreement between the employer, the employee and the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development
