Why consider Concentrated OYAP in Hairstyling?

- Hairstyling Concentrated OYAP is specifically designed to help secondary school students make a smooth transition directly into a career to complete their Apprenticeship
- The Hairstylist OYAP program offers the curriculum for level 1 and 2 apprenticeship training. Students must write exemption exams to achieve both levels
- This program can also be completed as a Specialist High Skills Major at some schools

In the Hairstylist OYAP program, students may:

- Shorten their apprenticeship by receiving apprenticeship hours while being registered as an OYAP Apprentice in Cooperative Education
- Receive Standard First Aid, Adult CPR, Young Worker Awareness and WHMIS certification
- Save money similar courses offered at colleges and private vocational training facilities can cost between \$6,000 -\$10,000. Why not start the program before you leave high school and earn credits towards your OSSD at the same time?

HOW DOES THIS PROGRAM WORK?

This program consists of 4 OYAP Hairstyling credits and a minimum of 2 Cooperative Education credits. The students should complete at least one grade 11 and one grade 12 Hairstyling credit before applying for the Hairstylist OYAP program.

Opportunities in Hairstyling OYAP

You could find a very rewarding career in a salon, barber shop, or spa as a Hairstylist or an Aesthetician. Maybe you could even work in film or theatre! There are many exciting careers in this field!

Apprenticeship

- Earn \$\$ while you learn
- Will be taught one-on-one by a Licensed Hairstylist
- An apprenticeship contract is an agreement between the employer, the employee and the Ministry of Labour Training, and Skills Development
