## **CREDITS**

### **Course Package**

Each SHSM program offers students a bundle of 8 - 10 credits. These courses are regular Ontario secondary school courses that allow students to work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, but have been bundled as the most relevant courses to prepare students for a future in the horticulture and landscaping sector.

### The Bundle Includes:

- 4 "major" credits in horticulture and landscaping in grade 11 and 12
- Supporting credits, which include Contextualized Learning Activities (opportunities for students to learn the subject in the context of the horticulture and andscaping sector):
  - > Grade 11 and/or 12 English credit
  - > Grade 11 and/or 12 Math credit
  - > Business Studies or Sciences
  - > 2 Cooperative Education credits to experience life in the horticulture and landscaping sector

All students in Halton are able to attend the Horticulture & Landscaping SHSM at White Oaks SS in grade 11 or grade 12. Each student's goals will be assessed and course selection will be determined based on individual needs.
