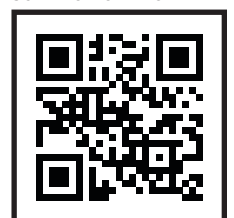

## WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT CONCENTRATED OYAP?

The program is designed to help students make an informed and smooth transition to a post-secondary apprenticeship pathway safely and competently. Students will be prepared for academic success in future apprenticeship courses.

**Dual Credit** Students will earn both high school and Mohawk College credits while attending this program; these are elective credits. These credits can be used to provide exemptions from future Mohawk College courses.

**Concentrated** in this program the students take two Construction courses and a two-credit Cooperative Education course. The program provides one semester of all day construction theory and workplace training (co-op) that is covered in most college construction programs.

**OYAP** is the Co-op component of the program. Students will take co-op in the afternoon and be registered as OYAP participants. The work hours gained at the student's work placement can be used to reduce the hours required to complete an apprenticeship.



## WHY TAKE THIS PROGRAM AT NOTRE DAME?
