WHAT IS HAIRSTYLIST CONCENTRATED OYAP?

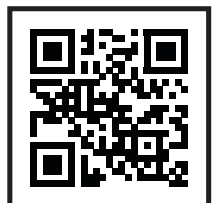
- ☑ Hairstylist Concentrated OYAP is specifically designed to help secondary school students make a smooth transition directly into the post-secondary apprenticeship program.
- ☑ Concentrated OYAP allows secondary school students to begin their post-secondary Hairstylist Apprenticeship while still in secondary school.
- ☑ Hairstylist Concentrated OYAP is also designed to help prepare students for academic success in the apprenticeship courses usually taught at college.
- ☑ Hairstylist Concentrated OYAP provides students with the unique opportunity to complete both levels of in-school apprenticeship training while still in high school.
 - ☑ (There may be a fee for exemption exams)
- ☑ Similar courses are offered at both colleges and private vocational training facilities, at a much higher cost.
- ☑ Cosmetology credits earned at other high schools count towards the total number of credits required to challenge each exemption exam.

WHY CONSIDER CONCENTRATED OYAP AT BISHOP REDING?

In Concentrated OYAP, students

- ☑ may shorten their apprenticeship.
- ☑ may get their foot in the door with a potential employer.
- ☑ may complete their first + second level of in-school apprenticeship training.
- ☑ may save thousands of dollars on similar courses offered at colleges and private vocational training centres.
- ☑ may still attend college or university if they meet the admission requirements.

WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

Apprenticeship is a form of post-secondary education in which students

- ☑ may earn while they learn.
- ☑ will be taught one on one by a certified skilled tradesperson and Ontario Certified Teacher.
- ☑ will be sent to take apprenticeship courses at college.
- ☑ will have the government pay approximately 80% of their tuition.



WHAT OTHER TRAINING WILL I RECEIVE?

Hairstylist Concentrated OYAP students will have the opportunity to earn the following additional certifications:

- ☑ Standard First Aid
- ☑ Adult CPR
- ☑ Young Worker Awareness
- ☑ WHMIS
- ☑ Will have the unique opportunity to earn an exemption from both levels of in-school training usually offered at a community college

Students also require a minimum of 2 Co-op credits. Hours can count toward your apprenticeship once you get registered. </p>		

Students should get registered as an OYAP apprentice after successful completion of the Level 1 exemption test.
